Student Process Map for COVID-19 (Fall 2020)

Student has symptoms and tests positive OR suspected to have COVID-19

Student notifies School Director and remains home for 14 days from positive test result. Student reports one or more COVID-19 symptoms or NOT feeling well BEFORE entry to building using screening tool

Teacher collects
completed screening
tool and advises
student's parents
they may not enter
the building. Parent
should contact their
primary care
physician for
guidance.**

The student may return to campus after 14 days have passed from positive test result and/or 14 days have passed from symptom onset and at least 72 hours have passed with no fever, without the use of fever-reducing medication and with negative test results.

If student was on campus in the last 48 hours...

Teacher identifies any other student or staff who were present in the same class/group on the last day the student who tested positive was present. Teacher will report those persons to the School Director. Student reports
experiencing one or
more symptoms of
COVID-19 or Not

during the school day

Student reports
someone at home
has COVID-19
symptoms OR
someone at home
has tested positive

This would be considered prolonged exposure to someone with COVID-19 or symptoms of COVID-19. Student cannot enter the building. Contact School **Director to notify. There is** no need to notify other parents or students regarding this scenario. Student should contact their primary care physician for guidance and remain home to self-isolate and avoid public spaces for 14 days.

Student reports to School Director that someone in their home was exposed to someone who tested positive or has symptoms.

If the someone at home is not symptomatic, but just 'exposed,' student may come to school and participate in school activities (no need to self isolate or notify any staff or students).

Director will send written notification of possible exposure to all staff and parent/guardian of students who were exposed. All student and staff who were exposed will be excluded from campus activities for 14 days from date of last exposure. Those persons will need to monitor their symptoms at home and contact their primary care provider if they develop. Students can return to school with proof of a negative test.

To be considered exposed to COVID-19, you need to have prolonged close contact with a person who has the virus. Close contact includes living in the same household, caring for a sick person with the virus, being within 6 feet of a sick person with the virus for at least 15 continuous minutes without the use of a face covering, or being in direct contact with secretions from the sick person. Due to State Laws the student's name will not be disclosed.

**Note: If the student has any illness symptoms they should first consult with their Pediatrician to determine if symptoms should be considered COVID-19 related or other illness not related to COVID. If Pediatrician advices these are NON-COVID-19 symptoms/Illness please provide a note from the Pediatrician to the School Director. Based on diagnosis School Director will advise how/when student may return to school.
